

## Pronoun-Antecedent Agreement

Write the answer to each item on the line before the item.

1. \_\_\_\_\_ This refers to the forms a pronoun takes to show its function in a sentence.
2. \_\_\_\_\_ This word refers to the case if the pronoun is the subject of a sentence.
3. \_\_\_\_\_ This words refers to the case if the pronoun is the object of a sentence or of a preposition.
4. \_\_\_\_\_ These words - I, we, you, he, she, it, they - are used to replace nouns that serve this function in a sentence.
5. \_\_\_\_\_ These words - me, us, you, him, her, it, them - are used to replace nouns that serve this function in a sentence.
6. \_\_\_\_\_ This word refers to the noun that a pronoun replaces. (BGS69)
7. \_\_\_\_\_ & \_\_\_\_\_ Pronouns & antecedents should agree in these two areas.
8. \_\_\_\_\_ This type of pronoun can be singular or plural and is usually gender neutral, meaning it is not clear if it refers to masculine or feminine. In other words, it is not definite.
9. \_\_\_\_\_ & \_\_\_\_\_ Gender means it is either this or this, other words for male or female.
10. \_\_\_\_\_ These pronouns - another, anybody, anyone, anything, each, either, everybody, everyone, everything, little, much, neither, nobody, no one, nothing, one, other, somebody, someone, and something - are considered this in number. (HiINT: Number means singular or plural.)
11. \_\_\_\_\_ These pronouns - both, few, many, others, several - are considered this in number. (HiINT: Number means singular or plural.)
12. \_\_\_\_\_ These pronouns - all, any, more, most, none, some - are considered this in number. (HiINT: Number means singular or plural.)
